Besides, to promote, disseminate and stimulate research on population issues at local levels, the IASP organises regional conferences in different parts of the country. In 2024, the IASP, jointly with Annamalai University, will organise the Southern Regional Conference at the Department of Population Studies.

THEME OF THE CONFERENCE

In India, the demographic dividend of a relatively younger and bigger working-age population is projected to continue increasing both in number and as a proportion of the total population through mid-century. However, while the population ages and its growth shrinks in the southern states of India, labour migration from the northern and eastern states will make up for it and the "demographic dividend" will continue there, according to the UN. The Total Fertility Rate ranges from 1.4 for Tamil Nadu and West Bengal to 3 for Bihar among the large states, with Kerala at 1.5. Labour migration from the youthful northern and eastern states could bolster the size of the workforce in the relatively older southern states, prolonging the demographic dividend in those regions. Against this backdrop, the theme of this regional conference of IASP is DEMOGRAPHY OF SOUTH INDIA: PROSPECTS AND CHALLENGES.
